Off Licence (For Premises)

Sections 17 to 20, and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

PURSUANT to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, **M & J Trading Ltd** is authorised to sell alcohol on the premises situated at 1 Norton Road, Hamilton, and known as “**Super Liquor Frankton**”, to any person for consumption off the premises and to supply alcohol free, as a sample, for consumption on the premises. The licensee is also authorised to sell alcohol on or from the premises and deliver it somewhere else.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with the Act.

CONDITIONS

This licence is subject to the following conditions:


- a) Alcohol may be sold only **from 9.00am to 10.00pm Monday to Sunday**.
- b) No alcohol is to be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1 pm on Anzac Day.
- c) The area where alcohol is to be sold is described in the plan date stamped as received by District Licensing Committee on 9 May 2017.
- d) The entire premises is designated as a supervised area (no persons under 18 can be in the area unless with their parent or legal guardian).
- e) The holder of a manager’s certificate or a properly notified manager shall be on duty and on the premises at all times alcohol is sold.
- f) A manager’s register (as required by s.232 of the Act) is to be maintained and available on site.
- g) A Host Responsibility Policy must be maintained and displayed in a prominent place that can be seen by customers and the licensee must ensure all staff receive training in their responsibilities and obligations under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.
- h) There must be no sale or supply of alcohol to minors or intoxicated persons and there must be displayed at every point of sale appropriate signs detailing these restrictions.
- i) Drinking water must be freely available and displayed whenever alcohol is being supplied by way of complimentary tastings.

The Licensee must ensure the following are displayed;

- i) A sign to be seen from outside the principal entrance stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for the sale of alcohol.
- ii) A copy of the original licence with all the conditions, just inside the principal entrance so persons entering can read it.
- iii) A sign in a prominent place identifying the duty manager.
