

OFF-LICENCE**Sections 17 to 20 and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012**

Pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act), United Liquid Limited is authorised to sell alcohol on or from the premises situated at 28 Great South Road NGARUAWAHIA and known as Super Liquor Ngaruawahia, to any person for consumption off the premises, to deliver it somewhere else, and to supply alcohol free, as a sample, for consumption on the premises.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

Conditions

- (a) No alcohol is to be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Christmas Day, Easter Sunday, or before 1.00pm on Anzac Day.
- (b) Alcohol may be sold under the licence only on the following days and during the following hours:
Monday to Sunday 9.00am to 10.00pm
- (c) The whole of the premises is designated as a supervised area.
- (d) Drinking water must be freely available to customers at the following places while alcohol is being supplied free as a sample on the premises: In the body of the premises near to where the samples are being provided.
- (e) The licensee must take the following steps to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - i. Display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.
- (f) The licensee must take the following steps to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the management of the premises are observed:
 - i. All staff will be trained in their responsibilities under the Act.
 - ii. A sign shall be prominently displayed inside the premises, which identifies by name the manager on duty or of the person responsible for the management of the sale and supply of alcohol under the licence.
- (g) No single bottles, cans or containers of beer, cider or RTDs priced at or less than \$6.00 per unit and/or in units 500ml or less are to be displayed or sold
- (h) The packaging of alcohol products as provided by wholesalers must not intentionally be broken down, however, in the event that packaging is damaged or broken it may be repackaged as a minimum of 4-pack.
- (i) No sales to persons in school uniform.
- (j) No irresponsible promotions of alcohol (such as those, as a minimum, set out in s.237 of the Act, including through any internet or social media channels (eg.Facebook).
- (k) Alcohol sold remotely must be done so in compliance with the following conditions:
 - i. Not be delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1pm on Anzac Day and must not be dispatched from the store for delivery between 9pm and 9am the following day.
 - ii. The licensee must take reasonable steps to verify that the buyer and receiver of an alcohol delivery is not under 18 years of age, and that the receiver (where present) is not intoxicated.
 - iii. Must not be deliver to intoxicated persons or persons under 18 years of age.
 - iv. The outside of the delivery package must contain a label with the following words: CONTAINS ALCOHOL - Do not deliver to intoxicated persons or persons under 18 years of age.
- (l) A copy of the licence must be displayed in a prominent place on the company internet site.
- (m) No transactions using Afterpay or similar "buy now, pay later" payment methods.
- (n) Appropriate signage regarding the restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons must be prominently displayed at each entry and adjacent to every point of sale.
- (o) Health promotion literature from Health NZ / Te Whatu Ora Health Promotion and / or the New Zealand Drug Foundation shall be visible and available in or beside the single alcohol area of the premises providing information on reducing harm from alcohol.
- (p) Pregnancy warning signs at least A3 in size shall be prominently displayed near the entrance.
- (q) A copy of the licence must be displayed at the principal entrance to the premises. The entrance from Great South Road is designated as the principal entrance.
- (r) The sale or delivery of alcohol is authorised on the premises generally. The premises situated at 28 Great South Road, Ngaruawahia, are more precisely identified in a plan date stamped as received by the Waikato District Council on 12 March 2025.

Display of Licence

A copy of this licence must be displayed at the principal entrance to the premises. The entrance from Great South Road is designated as the principal entrance.

Duration

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force-

- (a) until its expiry date detailed below; OR
- (b) if an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before the licence expires, until the close of the period 3 years after the expiry date.
